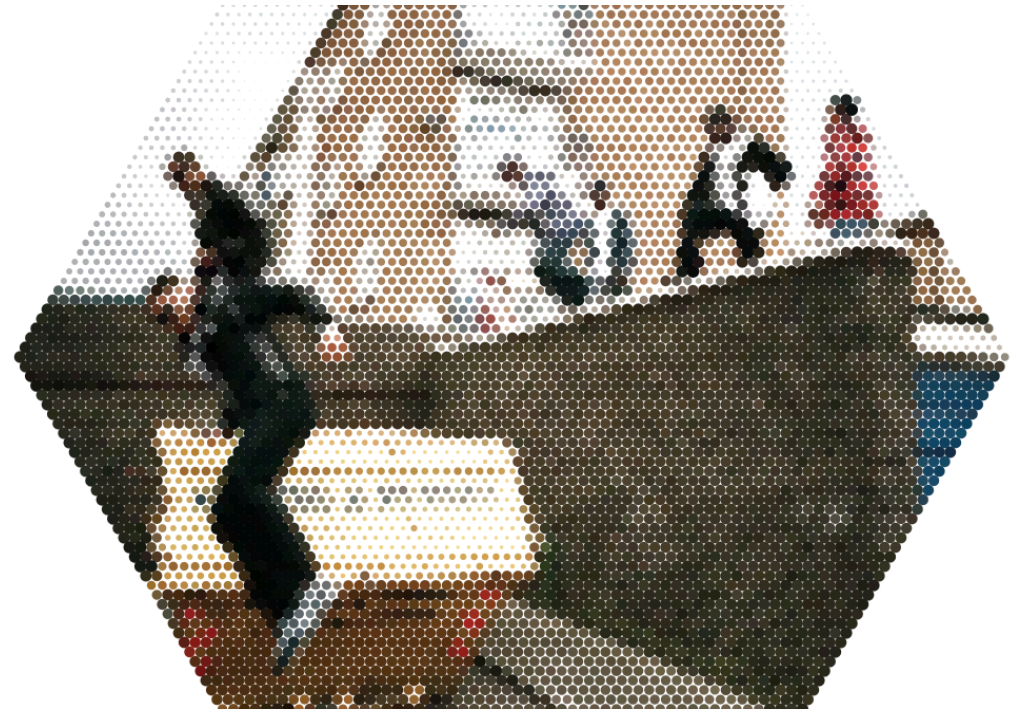


jeremy corbyn ain't your saviour

## so, autonomy?

in my own personal journey, i've come 2 a place where i've realised there is no separation between the political and the personal. that every way eye relate 2 others, every way others relate 2 me is built on the systems of domination that the world is also built on. anti-blackness, ableism, classism, (trans)misogynoir among others directly influence and dictate how we interact with one another, which is why eye now believe that autonomy - which the dictionary defines as "the right or condition of self-government," or as my friend Elizabeth puts it "a refusal to be governed," is the best way forward to lives that don't feel like death.

what happens when we refuse to be governed, by a labour or tory party every 5 years, by the state itself, by an international system of capitalism built on the backs of black people for over 400 years(?)

now this can be hard 2 imagine, we've been taught that we need the state, with its monopoly over force and violence 2 rule over us or there will be *anarchy. chaos.*

**rolling back of queer/LGBTQ+ rights in the so called "western" progressive countries).**

every vote in this election be it 4 labour, tories, green or lib dems is a vote that drives us further into: a **climate crisis** that our ppl in afrika, asia and tha caribbean will suffer most from, the continued strengthening of a **fascist police state**, a life that is simply death.

## so what do we do(?)

we are seemingly heading 2 a world where tha Labour Party is in power, either on its own 2 feet or in coalition with other parties (but u neva know w tha ~~racist~~ white vote). while many may proclaim anything but tha tories is good enough, i'd like 2 let niggas know that keir starmer is

- planning 2 recruit thousands of more police officers 4 more violence on neglected neighbourhoods
- "tougher consequences on knife crime" rather than any sort of transformative/reparative justice measures that actually looks at the needs of yutes who feel they need 2 protect themselves w a shank and the needs of their communities
- "stronger border control" which is essentially pandering 2 tha racist anti-migration crowd who fail 2 understand ppl leave their home countries because they are exploited by tha west, disabling these

that makes the world go by. in addition 2 this, the Labour Party has transformed from one that has always claimed 2 fight for the poor 2 one that has been called the Tories in red clothing.

what must be understood is that **no political party will save us**, even the smaller ones.

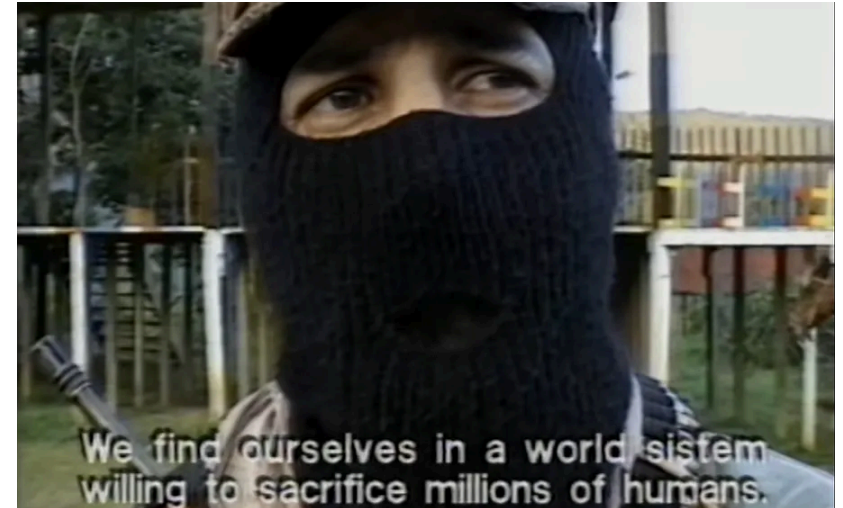
when we look at the genocide of Palestinians there is no mainstream political party that calls 4 the complete liberation of Palestine (greens 4 example call 4 a 2 state solution - **nvm that their "green" policies rely on the continued exploitation of Africa**). this doesn't even take into account how the mainstream political parties ignore the genocides in the DRC, Tigray, Sudan and Kashmir and the suffering of those we call the wretched of the earth.

this is because all these parties are not seeking fundamental changes 2 the state of the world, but rather seeking power 2 gain from the state of this world.

voting in this system cannot bring any material improvement 2 the conditions of the oppressed around the world because

- **ALL political parties clamouring for your vote are deeply committed 2 the continuation of racial capitalism and its anchoring by patriarchal relations (as seen by the rising transphobia and**

but what's chaos if not 1 in 5 people living in absolute poverty in this country, what's chaos if not 2 million people using food banks in 2023 compared to 60,000 in 2010. what's chaos if not the constant violence inflicted on black and brown peoples, be it from the police or immigration. the state relegates us (niggas) to economically neglected yet over-policed neighbourhoods, menial jobs and a constant state of barely treading water day by day, pay check to pay check. the time 4 change is now, the time 2 imagine more, of rejecting what they give us and creating our own ways of living.



## tha zapatistas(!)

now a whole lot of this seems lofty and abstract but there are countless examples of societies and communities that live and have lived outside the idea of the nation-state, that instead govern themselves and figure out how to exist collectively.

from pre-colonial societies of the Igbo 2 the autonomous region in Syria known as Rojava, people again and again have learned and struggled against oppression 2 live in non-state frameworks.

one of the most successful communities is that of the Zapatistas. indigenous peoples in Chiapas, Mexico rose up in 1994 in what is known as the Zapatistas revolution against the neoliberal policies of the Mexican government that sought to further marginalise indigenous communities and their ownership of the land they lived on.

30 years later, the Zapatistas have collectively organised 27 autonomous municipalities, collectively own and look after the land, built their own healthcare systems, primary and secondary schools and education programmes firmly rooted in their commitment to a struggle for *a world where many worlds exist*. the Zapatistas are a living, breathing example of autonomy, which they describe as *creating new life*.

such as universal healthcare are covered in the blood of the third/fourth worlds.

the wealth tha united kingdom has accumulated is directly from tha enslavement of afrikans and the exploitation of resources of tha third world over 400+ years. this wealth has been used, particularly by the Labour Party 2 get tha british working class 2 a level of comfort that **means it collaborates w the ruling class of babylon, rather than moving against it**. people here are stuck in a haze of material safety and comfort that means they would rather vote and work within this system of death and exploitation than put their bodies on tha line for more.

this doesn't even take into account how labour has consistently been anti-black and anti-muslim, be it in its **colonial policies, immigration policies** and tony blair's **law and order policies** 2 Keir Starmer's current wave of excommunicating black and brown MPs, **particularly womyn** and giving up seats 2 other fascists because a **young black mp candidate was gaining more popularity**.

what makes this election unique is that there is a level of ennui and disillusionment that many of my elders say they haven't seen eva.

the genocide tha zionist state is enacting on palestinians over the last 9 months has unveiled many peoples eyes as to how the two major parties are complicit and tha bloodshed

but voting can't give us the breath in our lungs that we so desire

many complained when the head of the international slavery museum accepted an OBE. it was seen as disrespecting all those who were captured by this empire, all the families violently separated, all the men, womyn, pikins and gender maroons who suffered in ways we cannot imagine

... but if that's a slap in the face of our ancestors than our vote is us spitting on their graves.

## labour day

we've often seen the labour party as the "black party", the party of the working class and the hero 2 tha Tories' villainous behaviour.

2 put it simply if the conservatives are the moustache-twirling, cat-stroking supervillain with a history of evil plans (which unlike in the comics have not been thwarted), the labour party has consistently been the shiny suit slicked-back hair philanthropist, fighting for "justice", smiling at minority communities while secretly slow-dripping poison into the meals they give us.

it must be stated loud and clearly that the benefits the labour party proclaim 2 have gifted onto the working class

## nu life in babylon(?)

so now, what is there 2 be done(?) we are living in a world where multiple genocides are being perpetrated while we live in the belly of the beast that plays a pivotal part in orchestrating em (the West/imperial core).

black and brown communities here in Babylon are bearing the brunt of the violence that the ruling classes of Babylon inflict on its inhabitants, forming internal colonies that are super-exploited by the state.

this can be seen in the disparities faced by these internal colonies in terms of maternal mortality rates, police brutality, underemployment, displacement via gentrification among other things. life aint been good, and it aint gonna get better, unless we say enough is enough and struggle for something more than this. unless we struggle for autonomy.

*if autonomy means 2 create nu life, what does that look like(?)*

what does it mean 2 create nu life in a world predicated on death? how do we look despair, neglect and violence in the face and constantly war against that(?)

by pooling our resources togetha, moving togetha, trusting each other and creating programmes and spaces where life can flow in ways the world doesn't want. we look 2 the past and learn how 2 create -

- housing co-ops that protect the most marginalised among us, we reclaim spaces and zones that have been captured and simply left 2 rot by the exploitative housing system.

*we turn estate blocks into gardens of eden*, with community gardens and food co-ops

- liberation schools where neglected black kids come and learn english, maths, history, afrikan languages, and whatever they desire all rooted in the knowledge that we all learn from each other, in non-hierarchical modes of educating.
- we engage in political education - turn back and remember our ancestors and their lessons, commune with those who fought for nu life be it in South Carolina or Azania (known as the settler state of South Africa)

## **election time, blessing time (?)**

and this makes me think

by the time this post drops a lot of us will be going 2 that ballot box, hoping for redemption/resurrection or just something better than the conditions we live in now. the job market's heart barely beats (as a nigga counting pennies eye know this 2 well), the nhs continues 2 decline, most ppl my age won't be house owners and the government asks for ceasefire with one mouth and vomits up funds and weapons for genocide with another.

a friend asked me who im voting for and eye told em no one

we offer up our vote as petition and pleas hoping that deities above will hear us



but its time 2 get off tha ride - don't u hear em scream(?)  
tha smog coats our lungs  
netflix covers our eyes  
and the latest diss track built on black womyn bruise blocks  
our ears

time 2 get off tha ride

yeah the ends is being gentrified  
but if our ancestors resisted colonial hands so can we

it is not seeking internship or degree 2 be free because black excellence isn't black liberation

given.
